News About Our Scholars & Graduates

2023 was a year filled with challenges concerning the country's situation and the personal situation of each student. Thank God you and I worked together in unity to overcome this. You helped us with a full and compassionate heart.

WE WORKED WITH THREE TYPES OF STUDENTS:

- 1. Those who are doing the 3-year training (for trade school type training)
- 2. Those who were already in the old 5year university system (for full degrees)
- 3. Those who are registered in the newer 4 -year university system (for full degrees)

Out of the 16 students, we had two finalists, Reagan Mutombo and Mendy Mandé. These two students graduated in December 2023.

We recorded several cases of illness, which were handled well.

The majority had good results from the faculty, and that is encouraging.

Next year, we have 6 finalist students on the list. Several will take the internships twice, which is why the budgets will always be increased a little. It is not easy to financially manage six finalist students.
